This bibliography was prepared in response to a request from the Training and Employee Relations Section of the Personnel Division of the Federal Public Housing Authority for a bibliography on housing for use of the housing apprentices of the Authority.

The bibliography is chiefly concerned with defense housing in the United States, and with the establishment and work of the Federal Public Housing Authority. As background material, a section is included on the history of American housing in the last decade.

Omitted for the most part are books or articles which deal with specific technical problems, or which discuss housing problems of any limited locale.

Items marked with an asterisk are especially comprehensive.

This bibliography was prepared in response to a request from the National and Foreign Relations Section of the University of the State of New York for a bibliography on health for the purpose of preparing the 1964-65 report.

The bibliography is chiefly concerned with health records in the United States, and with the activities of the National Health Service, and with the health records of the Federal Bureau of Investigation in connection with the health records in the last decade.

Books for the most part are those of interest which deal with specific health records, or with the health records of an individual.

Items marked with an asterisk are especially noteworthy.
