Introduction

- Severe rent burden and inadequate housing quality are the most serious indicators of poor housing.
- There are two data sources that can be used to count households with these problems:
 - The American Housing Survey
 - The American Community Survey



What Are Worst Case Needs?

Population:


- Unassisted renter households
- Incomes less than 50% of Area Median Income (AMI).

• Criteria:

- Monthly housing cost >= 50% of income
- OR living in severely inadequate housing



"Very Low Income" Renter Households with Problems





Differences Among WCN Measures

- AHS (42%):
 - Unassisted renter households
 - Incomes <= 50% of AMI
 - Cost burdens >=50% or severely inadequate housing.
- Factfinder (75%):
 - Renter households
 - Incomes <= \$35,000
 - Cost burdens >= 30%, no quality measure



Differences Among WCN Measures

• Joint Center (43%):

- Renter households
- Incomes <= 1st quartile
- Cost burdens >=50%

• CHAS (49%):

- Renter households
- Incomes <= 50% AMI
- Cost burdens >= 50% or substandard housing



Why Use Each Estimate?

• AHS

- Most accurate specification
- Can be used to analyze subgroups (with difficulty)
- Little subnational geography (regions, metro areas)
- Historical data available back to 1985
- Updated every two years
- Fact finder
 - Easy to access
 - Updated most quickly
 - All ACS geography
 - Least accurate specification



Why Use Each Estimate?

- Joint Center
 - Fairly accurate specification
 - Easy de get
 - National data only
 - Updated every year, with a lag
- CHAS
 - Good specification
 - State & county data
 - Access via complicated spreadsheets
 - Annual updates, relies on three-year averages
