### TRAINING OVERVIEW

Join in a special Sustainable Construction training, to be held at the St. Regis Mohawk Tribe, May 7-9, 2013. Sustainable construction offers tribal communities many benefits: control over energy costs, more durable and healthy housing, and a lighter environmental footprint. But how can you move from an inefficient home to having an overall energy-efficient, sustainable housing stock?

This 2 ½-day workshop uses real-life examples to offer information on benchmarking and modeling, smart retrofit choices, opportunities to leverage funds with utility companies, and neighborhood sustainability. This training will also feature a tour of the new Sunrise Acres housing, developed by the Akwesasne Housing Authority and may include an optional tour of a hydropower project visitors' center.
