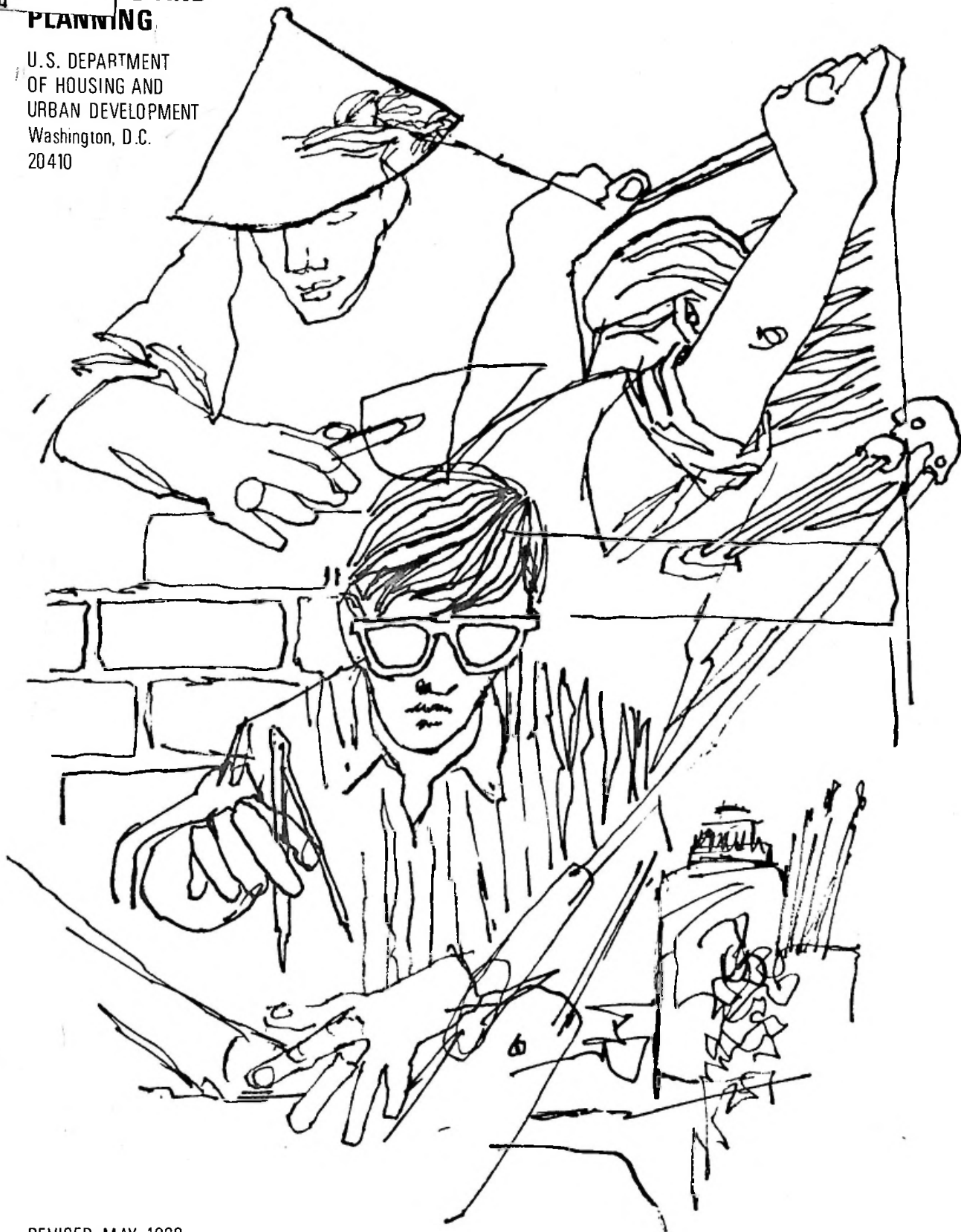

This bibliography was prepared by the Library, Department of Housing and Urban Development, at the request of the Agency for International Development, (A.I.D.), chiefly for program use in developing countries.

It is a selection of approximately 400 recent books and periodicals available in the United States on housing, building and planning. Where titles are not self-explanatory, brief annotations have been made. The inclusion of a publication does not mean endorsement by the Federal Government.

A.I.D. Missions and host country officials who are concerned with housing and planning should find this bibliography valuable in establishing basic technical collections. It may also be helpful to libraries, universities, financial institutions, architects, planners, builders and others.

A.I.D. personnel may obtain books and journals indexed in the bibliography through regular channels of A.I.D. Mission procurement with Mission funds. Copies of the publications listed are not available from A.I.D. Headquarters except for those of the Department of Housing and Urban Development or the Agency for International Development. These may be obtained by A.I.D. Missions on request.
