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Introduction

This bulletin contains the specifications and quantities of furniture and movable equipment for FPFA child service facilities.

The bulletin is divided into two parts: the central procurement schedule and the auxiliary list. The first part, pages 1 through 15, specifies the standard furniture and equipment items which will be purchased by the Procurement Division of the Central Office of FPFA. This portion of the Bulletin will serve that Division as the contract specification in negotiating for the purchase of the equipment and furniture therein described.

The "Special" list, indicated in the schedule of equipment on pages 9 and 10 provides for the furnishing of the community hall in the Standard Tenant Activity Building No. 111 where this room is to be used as a child service facility. ^{1/} This "Special" list is not a part of the standard equipment for building No. 111 and will be furnished only on request from the regional office. The "Special" list shall also be provided for child service facilities in the non-standard or regionally designed tenant activity buildings where such space provides for fewer children than does the standard child service wing in the No. 112 and No. 114 tenant activity buildings.

The second part of the Bulletin, or auxiliary list, pages 16 through 29, specifies the furniture and equipment which are suggested as desirable additions to the standard items but which are to be provided at the determination of the FPFA Regional Offices. The items on the auxiliary list will not be purchased by the Central Procurement Division but by the regional offices and/or by the agencies operating these facilities.

SPECIFICATIONS FOR MOVABLE EQUIPMENT
FOR CHILD SERVICE FACILITIES

GENERAL SCOPE

Under this section of the specification is included the furnishing of movable equipment for child service rooms as hereinafter specified. It is intended that new materials shall be used throughout.

The Equipment Layout plans for buildings #132, #133, and #134, revised April 1, 1943, and for the child service wings of the #112 and #114 tenant activity buildings, dated April 14, 1943, indicate a suggested arrangement and location of equipment.

Equipment shall be delivered by the contractor in appropriate protected containers, each clearly marked.

MANUFACTURE

All manufactured equipment either as specified, or substituted as equal to that specified, shall be furnished by the Contractor. The specific article, material, or equipment mentioned shall be understood as indicating the type, function, minimum standard of design, efficiency and quality desired and shall not be construed in such a manner as to exclude manufacturers' products of comparable quality, design and efficiency. The decision of the contracting officer that an article, material, or equipment is equal, or is not equal, to the item specified shall be final.

MATERIALS AND FINISH

Whenever called for, wood shall be either ash, maple, birch, or other hardwood proper to the use of the article. All wood that is put underground shall be of cypress or other water-resisting wood and shall be properly creosoted in all portions underground and 6" above. Where natural finish is required the same shall be one coat of linseed oil and two coats of Duco Dulux or equal special outdoor finish, either applied by brush or spray. Where painted finish is called for the same shall be one coat of sealer and primer, one coat of heavy oilpaint and one coat of enamel. All paints, varnishes and enamels shall be of high grade standard brands and used from original packages or containers according to the manufacturers' directions.

EQUIPMENT

Designations used for the articles listed are from the catalogues of the Educational Equipment Company 69 Bank Street, New York, N. Y., hereafter called "Ed-Co," and other equipment companies as indicated. These designations are intended merely as guides to the kind and quality desired. The items called for shall be furnished in accordance with the quantities indicated in the schedules on pages 9-15.

ITEM NO. 1 - TABLES

Furnish the following tables:

Rectangular Tables. These shall be 36" x 23", similar to No. 704E, "Ed-Co". Heights shall be 18" and 20", in the quantities scheduled.

Round Tables. These shall be 36" in diameter and 18" high.

Serving Tables. These shall be semi-automatic folding, 20" high x 60" long x 23" wide, similar to Howe Folding Furniture Co., Table No. 12, except as to size.

All tables shall have natural finish.

ITEM NO. 2- CHAIRS, CHILDREN

Chairs shall be similar in construction to that of the Reelsboro Chair Company of Vermont, made with lock joints, and similar to Nos. 709 and 710, "Ed-Co.". Heights shall be 10", 12" and 14", in the quantities indicated in the schedule. Backs shall be 22" and 24" high. All chairs shall have natural finish.

ITEM NO. 3 - CHAIRS, ADULT

Adult chairs shall be of the type A.G. as shown on plate 4 of Bulletin No. 22, "Interior Furnishings for Project Services Facilities," April 1, 1943, and shall be similar to Wisconsin Chair Company No. P-400.

ITEM NO. 4 - FOOT STOOLS

Foot stools shall be of special design, as indicated on Plate 1 of this bulletin.

ITEM NO. 5 - DESKS

Desks shall be similar to the desk D.B. as shown on plate 10 of Bulletin No. 22 and as specified in Bulletin No. 18, Furniture and Equipment Specifications for Tenant Activities Buildings and Cafeterias for Dormitory Projects. Provide each desk with locking file drawer. Desks shall be of natural finish.

ITEM NO. 6 - FILING CABINETS

Filing cabinets shall be of standard size three drawers, oak wood, and on appropriate sectional base. Remington Rand or equal. They shall be of natural finish.

ITEM NO. 7 - COTS

Cots shall be 27" wide x 12" high x 52" long, with rigid frame of 1-1/16 x 2-1/4" best quality hardwood. Corners shall be mitered, tongue and grooved with wood block braces. Joints of all wood shall be glued and screwed with counter-sunk wood screws. Frame shall be rounded on outside top and bottom. Outside top and bottom corners of frame shall be rounded. Legs shall be 1-3/16" x 1-1/4" best quality hardwood, hinged to corner brackets and held in place by folding metal braces of 18 ga. minimum. Legs shall fold inside of frame. Top of frame shall be covered with 15 oz. (min.) cotton duck. ("Ed-Co." Rest Cots - No. 714E or equal)

ITEM NO. 8 - PADS

Pads shall be furnished for each of the above cots and shall be 32 oz. weight, Ozite or equal, pad to fit each cot.

ITEM NO. 9 - COVERS

For each of the above pads there shall be furnished an 8 oz. brown duck or equal slip cover to enclose the pads. Each pad shall be equipped with a properly fastened flap on top as well as a loop for each corner as directed.

ITEM NO. 10 - COT DOLLIES

These shall be shown and called for on plate 1 of this bulletin.

ITEM NO. 11 - CASTLE GYM

This apparatus shall be similar to "Ed-Co." No. 514E, complete in five sections, with adjustable platforms. The gym shall be built of best quality, straight grain, kiln dried ash, hickory or maple, which will not check, sliver, or decay out of doors. The posts shall be 2-3/4" by 2-3/4", spaced 22" apart, center to center. Rungs shall be of 1-3/8" diameter ash, hickory, or maple, and fitted into 1" diameter holes in posts. Rungs shall be spaced 8" center to center except for 2' at top, on four section sides and 12" center to center on remaining 2' at top, and on opposite four section sides as indicated on plate 3 of this Bulletin. The sliding pole shall be 2-3/8" diameter ash, hickory, or maple. The rope shall be of the best quality smooth marine 5/8" 4 ply manila rope. Each platform shall be of 7/8" thick ash, hickory, or maple in two sections, and provided with heavy cleats on the underside. Platforms shall be shaped to provide clearance for hands and body in climbing and sliding, and fit about the posts to prevent slipping off the rungs.

ITEM NO. 11 (Cont'd)

Each side of a section shall be further reenforced by two Bessemer steel, zinc-coated tie rods at top and bottom to prevent spreading of posts. Height of posts of center platform shall be 7'-3". Height of posts of surrounding four sections shall be 6'-3". Outside measurements shall be $68\frac{1}{2}" \times 68\frac{1}{2}"$. Each platform shall be $23\frac{1}{2}" \times 23\frac{1}{2}"$. This apparatus shall be finished in natural varnish.

ITEM NO. 12 - SAW HORSES

These shall be of the following types and sizes, all with natural finish:

- 8" high, "Ed-Co." No. 522E or equal.
- 12" high, "Ed-Co." No. 523E or equal.
- 18" high, "Ed-Co." No. 524E or equal.

Construction shall be as specified in the "Ed-Co." catalogue.

ITEM NO. 13 - CLIMBING APPARATUS

This shall be 45" high by 8'-0" long by 19" wide, similar to "Ed-Co." No. 501E, and as specified in that catalogue. Also, this apparatus shall be equipped with one portable ladder, 64" long by 14" wide, similar to "Ed-Co." No. 505. All shall be of natural finish.

ITEM NO. 14 - STEPS AND PLATFORM

These shall be as shown on plate 2 of this bulletin.

ITEM NO. 15 - BOARDS

Furnish the following natural finished boards:

Teeter-totter boards, 8'-0" long x 10" wide by 1-1/8" thick, otherwise similar to "Ed-Co." No. 527E.

Boards, 10'-0" long by 10" wide by 1-1/8" thick, but ends shall be shaped as indicated on plate 5 of this bulletin. Cleats shall be attached to these boards to fit over and lock on rungs of the ladder specified under Item No. 13 similar to "Ed-Co." No. 528.

ITEM NO. 17 - DETACHABLE SLIDE

This shall be similar to "Ed-Co." No. E514D and shall be constructed to fasten at any section of the castle gym, Item No. 11, and at any desired height. Slide shall be of natural finish.

ITEM NO. 18 - PARALLEL BARS

Parallel bar apparatus shall be as shown and called for on plate 4 of this bulletin and shall be constructed carefully to detail. Natural finish shall be used.

ITEM NO. 19 - WAGONS

Similar to "Ed-Co." No. E 510 A. Body shall be 3/16" thick best quality hardwood with mortised construction throughout. Ends reenforced with 1/4" tie rods to prevent spreading. Bottom reenforced with three wide hardwood cleats. Body shall be 28" long, 13 1/2" wide by 3" deep; all edges and corners rounded, and fastened with galvanized wood screws, bolts and nuts only; no nails. Wheels shall be 8" double disc steel with fifth wheel stamped metal gear for easy steering. If wheels, axels, turning gear and tongue cannot be obtained in metal, wood may be substituted and in which case drawings must be submitted for approval. Where wood under-construction is used all shall be of the best grade laminated hardwood, axels shall be continuous and wheels shall be five ply.

ITEM NO. 20 - SAND BOXES

These shall be as shown and called for on plate 4 of this bulletin. All portions underground shall be creosoted. All portions above ground shall be natural finish. Sand box shall be equipped with locking device so that the four hinged covers may be securely fastened when box is not in use.

ITEM NO. 22 - SCREENS

Stationary screens shall be furnished similar to "Ed-Co." No. 717E, size 33" x 48". Screens shall be of natural finish except that the panels shall be finished with two coats of shellac.

ITEM NO. 23 - STEPS

For use in front of children's toilets, furnish steps as shown and called for on plate 5 of this bulletin.

ITEM NO. 24 - PACKING CASES

These shall be furnished in two sizes, as follows:

48" long by 36" wide by 29" deep.

25" long by 23" wide by 16" deep.

Cases shall be open on the top. They shall be made of 7/8" cedar or pine, with natural finish, and shall be constructed as shown and called for on plate 5 of this bulletin.

ITEM NO. 25 - LADDER BOX

This small climbing apparatus shall be similar to that shown and specified for "Ed-Co." No. 529E. Natural finish shall be used.

ITEM NO. 27 - TEA TABLE AND CHAIRS

Tea Table shall be 23" long by 23" wide by 18" high, similar to "Ed-Co." No. 706E, painted and decorated to match chairs below and made with 5 ply pine top. Furnish with each tea table one set of four painted and decorated Mexican rush seat ladder backed chairs similar to those obtainable at "Ed-Co." Size of chairs shall be 10" high, 16 $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide and 14" deep, narrowing toward the back.

ITEM NO. 29 - EASELS

Furnish double adjustable easels similar to "Ed-Co" No. 901E.

ITEM NO. 31 - WHITE GOODS - BLANKETSA. Sheets

These shall be 68-72 count, extra heavy preshrunk unbleached and hemmed muslin sheets. Each sheet shall be cut and hemmed and at the corners supplied with strong 1" tapes to tie around corner of cots. Sheets shall be of sizes required for the cots indicated in Item No. 7.

B. Duck Sheets

These shall be Vinylite, or equal, double coated, .014 to .015 finished thickness, weight - 2.10 oz. per yard, size - 27" x 27".

C. Blankets

These shall be double solid color blankets as selected. Blankets shall be closely woven with 25% combed wool and 75% combed cotton double napped. Top and bottom edges shall be bound with fine mercerized cotton satin 2" on each face. Size 50" x 126" minimum or nearest standard size to double over.

D. Towels

These shall be good quality terry cloth turkish towels size 12" x 15". Each towel shall be supplied with $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide tape loop. Hanging length of loop shall be $\frac{3}{4}$ ".

G. Oil Cloth

Furnish in rolls, cotton-backed noncracking oil cloth 46" wide; 12 yds. to the roll, color as selected.

ITEM NO. 32 - BATHROOM SUPPLIESB. Paper Towel Cabinet

D. Screw Hooks

To be supplied by other contractors.

E. Linen Hamper

Similar to Wells No. 2011, or equal, Hospital Equipment Corporation, 18" inside diameter by 30" overall height, top ring and uprights 1" diameter steel tubing. It shall have swivel casters of 2" diameter, composition or steel wheels. Construction shall be electrically welded throughout. Casters inserted in ends of uprights. Finish shall be painted and baked on grey enamel. Furnish two laundry bags for each hamper. Bags shall fit frames and shall be approximately 20" in diameter and 28" long, made in one piece of 8 oz. awning duck. They shall be provided with 3/4" looped hem for drawstring. Drawstring shall be furnished. The frame of hamper may be made of hardwood instead of metal.

F. Scales

These shall be Fairbanks (or equal) clinical scales with measuring rod similar to No. 12900 in Hospital Equipment Corporation catalogue. Natural finish is to be used.

SPECIFICATIONS FOR EQUIPMENT FOR KITCHENS
OF CHILD SERVICE FACILITY BUILDINGS

GENERAL

The following list of equipment shall be furnished for use in the kitchens of Child Service Center Buildings No. 132, No. 133, and No. 134. The length and position of the cupboards shall be adjusted according to the varying sizes of the kitchens in these structures. Other variances in equipment are indicated below. Kitchen equipment for the single child service room is identical with that specified for the Kitchens of Standard Tenant Activity Buildings Nos. 111, 112, 113, 114, 115 as shown in Bulletin No. 31.

The quality, type, and size of the items set forth in these specifications are intended to set the desired standard of the equipment required. Due to current manufacturing limitation of the War Production Board and the availability of stock at the time the equipment is contracted for, it may be necessary to vary from these standards from time to time in the quality, type, and size of equipment furnished. In view of these possible changes in sizes of certain major items as ranges, refrigerators, etc., it is recommended that the project engineer delay the setting of any adjoining equipment to these items until exact overall dimensions of the actual equipment to be furnished is obtained. The items designated with an asterisk are at the time of this revision restricted to certain special fabricating limitations of the War Production Board, but are to be furnished when available through shelf stock or allowable sales of surplus contract production.

Every effort shall be made to maintain the standard of quality established by these Specifications. Reference to any article, device, fixture, product or material by proprietary name, make or catalogue number shall be interpreted as establishing a standard of quality and shall not be construed as limiting competition. The contractor in such cases, at his option, may use any article, device, fixture, product or material which, in the judgment of the contracting officer, expressed in writing, is equal to that named.

All structural work as sinks, shelves, cupboards, installation of plumbing, piping, electric wiring, and outlets, etc., including any necessary changing of existing work, are under another contract.

The equipment called for in this specification shall be packed in proper containers to insure its delivery in perfect condition to the site. Containers shall be appropriately marked and shipped f.o.b. contractor to the local project. Site delivery, unpacking, and any necessary setting-up and connections shall be under another contract.

The amount of critical material used in the construction of the herein specified items shall not exceed the limits established by the Federal Agencies having control over such limitations.

SPECIFICATIONS FOR ADDITIONAL AUXILIARY EQUIPMENT
FOR CHILD SERVICE ROOMS

The items listed and described under this portion of the specification are intended for regional and/or local purchase and therefore will not be supplied through the Consolidated Procurement Program. Otherwise, the general conditions at the head of the Specifications for Movable Equipment in this Bulletin governs all the items under the Auxiliary Equipment Specifications.

ITEM NO. 16 - DRAG BOXES

These shall be built of 5/8" solid boards of clear pine enclosing all six sides properly lock jointed and with corner blocks; entire height glued together with waterproof glue. Size 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 23 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". There shall be 3" x 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " lifting cut outs to properly balance in carrying, on the long faces, and two holes with 5/8" rope or cord supplies for dragging. Finish natural.

ITEM NO. 21 - DUMP TRUCK

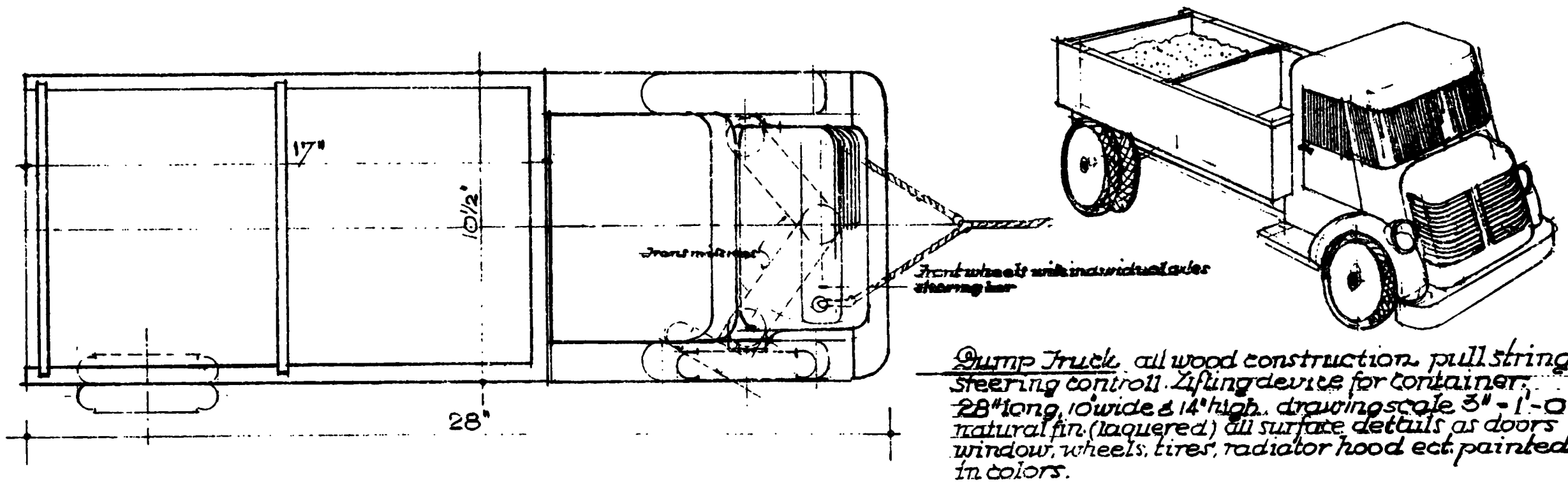
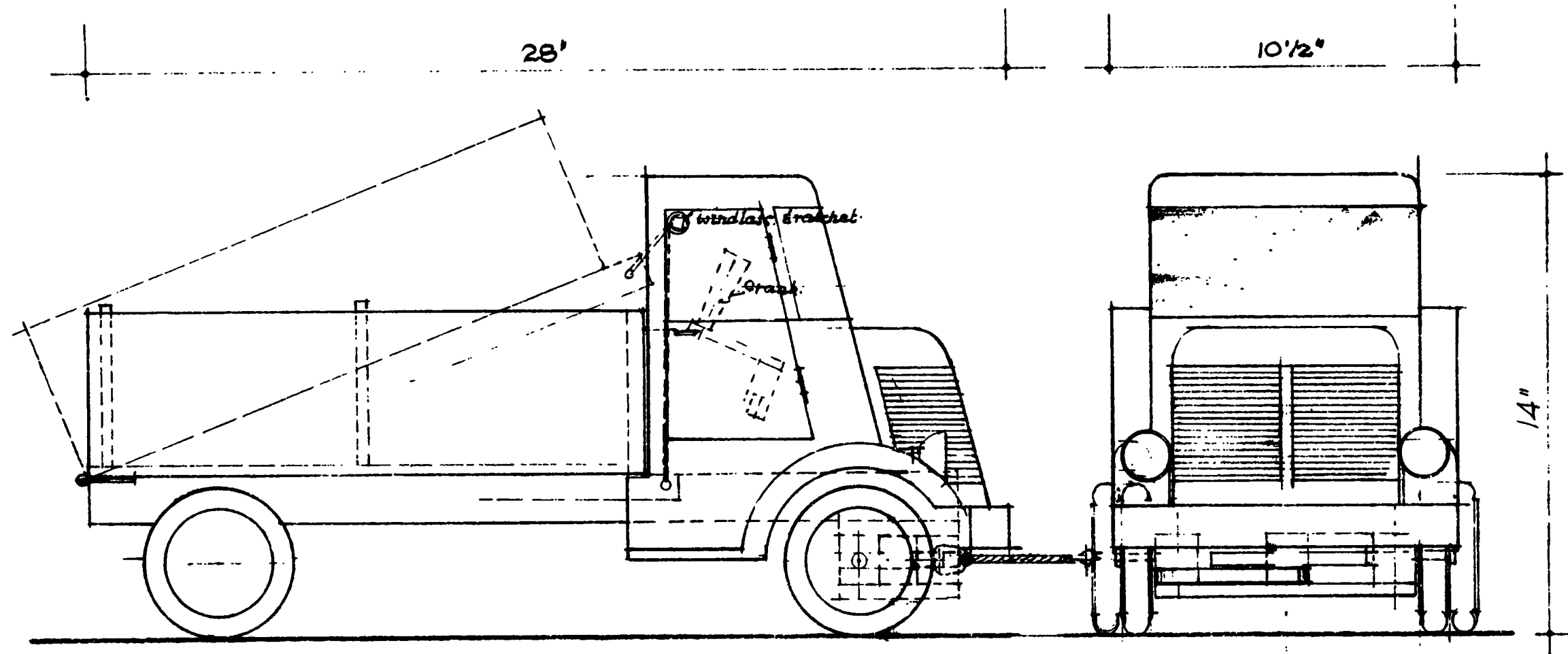
Plan & Elevations of Cupboard
