The Farm Bill establishes the food and agricultural policy for the nation and is one of the most significant forces affecting food security, farming and local economies. Join representatives of the Food and Agriculture Policy Collaborative, a partnership of national and local organizations, working together to promote a vision of food security, healthy food and healthy economies through the advancement of four policy objectives. The process of developing a new Farm Bill occurs twice a decade, and citizen engagement in that process presents a unique opportunity to advance a vibrant, healthy, and economically sustainable food system that supports both consumers and producers. Explore why and how supporting efforts to improve food security and healthy, local foods can strengthen socially and economically disadvantaged communities. Also hear presentations about on-the-ground best practices around healthy lifestyle and healthy food initiatives at HBCUs.
